



### Accreditation Status: National, Regional, State in Place

The University of Saint Joseph School of Pharmacy and Physician Assistant Studies' Doctor of Pharmacy program is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education, 135 LaSalle Street, Suite 4100, Chicago, IL 60503, 312/664-3375; FAX 312/664-4652, web site [www.acpe-accredit.org](http://www.acpe-accredit.org).

The University of Saint Joseph is fully accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC).

The School of Pharmacy and Physician Assistant Studies and the Doctor of Pharmacy Program are fully accredited by the State of Connecticut.

### On-time Graduation Rates (Class of 2018): 82.5%

Our fifth class graduated in May 2018. For this class, 82.5% of the entering cohort graduated on-time. Those who did not graduate on time remain with the program, extending their term of study for various reasons.

### First-time NAPLEX Passing Rates (2018): 78%

78.1% of our graduates with reported first-time NAPLEX scores passed on their first attempt in 2018, as of January 15, 2019. Our five-year average first-time pass rate is 83.9%.

### Student Retention Rates (as of January 1, 2019): 99.1%

Of the 230 students who entered with the current P1, P2, and P3 cohorts, one left the program due to academic insufficiency and one for nonacademic reasons, leading to an overall retention rate of 99.1%.

### Pass Rates for End-of-Year Integrative Experience Courses

Pass rates for the capstone courses PHCY 795 (P1 year) for the past three years and for PHCY 895 (P2 year) for the past two years have been 100% in all cases.

### Graduates with Fellowships and Residencies

In 2018, 12 of our graduates went on to a fellowship or residency. This represents 57% of the 21 students who sought them.

### Community Service Hours Completed:

Each Pharmacy student completes at least 20 hours of health-related community service annually. The Class of 2018 and the current cohort (Classes of 2019-2021) have completed over 15,000 hours of service as of January 1, 2019.
