

The six-year graduation rate for USJ is currently 68%. The federal government calculates graduation rates at 150% of time to degree. For students enrolled in the four-year Bachelor's degree, their graduation rate is calculated after six years from the date they entered. The USJ six-year graduation rate is based on an incoming Fall 2011 undergraduate cohort of 157 full time, first year in college, new students, with 107 students earning a Bachelor's degree by August 31, 2017.
